





Why is identifying your career path important?

What is the first step anyone follows when ready to pursue a new job?

- 1- Update a resume
- 2- Send it to as many employers as possible and
- 3- Wait for a response

Follow this formula today and you will be looking for employment for a very long time. Although this process worked at one time, it does not work today. Unlike the average applicant who follows just two steps when pursuing a career (update a resume and send it out to as many employers as possible), successful applicants follow five distinct steps.

#### THE OLD NO LONGER WORKS:

The Formula for Long-Term Unemployment Is: Update a resume > Apply for jobs > Wait for a response

#### blueprint for success

The step you are completing now, Step Two, is very important to attracting employers. This is a different employment market when compared to the last time you were searching for employment. And changes in the market now require that you diligently follow this step.

Building a resume without proper planning is like building a structure without a blueprint.





#### A resume is similar to a structure

A blueprint is essential to any structure. It provides the builder with a bird's-eye view of the total project before the structure is built. It also allows the builder to define details such as how much material is needed, where the infrastructure will be located, and other details such as where each entry will be placed. Even where the electrical box or the pantry will be located are all taken into consideration.

Cosmetics usually come last. Furthermore, the foundation and framework of the structure are the most important considerations. A beautiful building built on sand has very little value. A marketing plan is also important to attract the right buyer after the structure is built. After all, what is the purpose of building the structure if no one will buy it?

Now think about this: What is the first thing anyone does when they start looking for work? They start updating a resume, but skip the planning stage. A resume structured without proper planning (a blueprint) in today's employment landscape is to leave the outcome to luck; any results produced are purely accidental.

A surgeon spends years attending school preparing for a single surgery. He or she performs each surgery with precision, knowing any mistakes could cost a life.

The military executes plans with surgical precision for the same reasons. Nothing can be left to chance or luck. Since time is of the essence, you do not want to leave the outcome to luck.

Updating a resume without a plan is blindly creating a document, hoping for the best. Inevitably the resume requires ongoing revisions, re-writes, and in most cases, all these are instituted aimlessly.

A resume composed based on careful planning does not require any more revisions. Outside of minor tweaking, it attracts the right jobs when presented and gets the phone to ring.

Some ask: "How do I fit twenty years of experience on one page?" Others ask: "Why do employers think of me as over-qualified, under-qualified, or unqualified?"

Others may not know how to handle a gap in a resume. Proper planning addresses these issues, ensuring that employers regard you precisely as you intend.

Planning your career path could take weeks, but devising the right resume takes only hours.



You have a choice.

You can either wait when devising your career path or skip it and wait for a response when applying.

If you cut this step short, the time you spend waiting for a response that stems from a poorly composed resume takes far longer than planning your career path does.

When your career path is identified, you feel confident and gain a clear direction. This confidence and sense of direction will help you generate the enthusiasm successful applicants take to every meeting.



There are many different ways to identify one's career path. The one introduced in this manual is the most direct and easy-to-follow approach.

I have read books that complicate the process so much that you get lost in the process. Being lost defeats the whole purpose. The idea is to achieve clarity. There are many ways to achieve the same objective and define a career path. I have chosen this method because over the years, I have recognized it as the most effective. We will identify your career path in three easy steps.

# CHASIGE Uncomfortable

Before we get started, let's acknowledge that **change** is *uncomfortable* and realize adapting to it is necessary. We adapt to change every day. We adapt when seasons change, as we age, or when our living conditions change. Although uncomfortable, we can also adapt to changes in our career path.

# PATIENCE IS A VIRTUE

A job seeker once said to me: "But, I need to start my resume now. This career path business takes too much time. When do we get to the resume? I don't have the time to go through this process. I need a job and have to create a resume and send it out ASAP. I cannot afford to wait."


My response was "You cannot afford to remain unemployed." That is why it is important to take our time when defining your career path.

It is not a coincidence that those who are patient when looking for work are far more effective in finding employment than those who are not. You have a choice. You can either wait when devising your career path or skip it and wait for a response when applying. If you cut this step short (Identifying the Right Career Path), the time you spend waiting for a response because of a poorly composed resume takes far longer than planning your career path does.

The good news is that planning your career path can take weeks, but creating your resume when you thoroughly plan your steps can take only hours. Take your time when completing these exercises.

# Identify Your Career Path STEP TWO

#### achieving clarity empowers you





Notice we said strength and not skill. You may possess skills but you may also have strengths that are not viewed as skills but can be honed and presented as a skill. For instance, you may possess the skills of customer service management but may also enjoy working with numbers. Taking a short course in accounting may now provide you with a new skill in bookkeeping.

In identifying your path, take three steps:

- 1- Identify your strengths
- 2- Research those strengths to identify their relevance in your locality
- 3- Prioritize the strengths identified and prepare the path for the resume

# Identify YOUR Strengths

What strengths do you possess? Are your strengths viewed by employers as assets?

Let's imagine that a person with a strong background in marketing and advertising is looking for a job in that field. Let's further imagine that he needs to get back to work immediately. Assuming he lives in an area where those skills are <u>not sought after</u>, what other strengths does he possess that he can use immediately to become an asset to an organization in his locality?

Most people I know possess more strengths than they are aware of.

Are you aware of yours?

How are those strengths viewed in your locality? Are they popular or temporarily not in demand? Do you need to acquire any new skills? How long will that take?

These are the types of questions we must address prior to devising a resume.
